The St. Anthony Airport Board has been re-appointed. Members are Neils Thueson, Weldon Reynolds, Dee Young, Neil Shupe, Herb Parker, Joe Thueson and Penny Stanford. As the city liaison to the board, I am a voting member, and Mayor Beck serves as an ad hoc member. Sam Buckley has been hired to continue as the airport manager.

The city has applied for a grant to seal coat the runway this year. We will

hold a public hearing April 6 during our regular city council meeting on a proposal to raise the hangar fees at the airport and to charge commercial fees for commercial users. We are trying to organize a fly-in this summer as a fund-raiser for other projects at the airport. We would like to install fuel tanks with a card reader system so that pilots can purchase fuel 24 hours a day.

The city has bid on a used street sweeper to replace the old one, which is in disrepair and not worth fixing again.

Spring has sprung and the Wastewater Plant contractor is back into a “go for it” construction mode.

They are full swing on finishing the “Headwork's Building”, the new Chlorine Building and the (MS) Measuring Station. The MS is where

the flows from JCC, City of Parker, and ours comes together and each flow is measured. From there the inflow goes into the Headwork's and is screened to remove solids then directed to Lagoon #1 for the start of the aerobic aeration process.

There are three buildings will have concrete block construction above the

foundation. Ceilings and roofs will be wood trusses. When the block crew comes, it is expected they will only be here a few days. In and out at a fast rate.

Edstrom Contractors are also working diligently on the remaining sewer and water line extensions on East Bridge and the

Landfill Road going north of Broulims. Manholes, telemetry equipment and pumps are being installed in the sewer mains making them "lift" stations.

Starting in April the city will have 3 dumpsters on the north side of city hall. These will be for anyone who would like to participate with recycling. The bins will be marked for aluminum, plastic, and newspapers
