The Wastewater Plant Contractor, Edstrom Const., is whipping up a storm. Great news! The sewer and water lines on N. Bridge and the Landfill Roads are complete. The new and rebuilt sewer lift stations in town are complete. A lift station is where the sewer lines need slope down for

the flow and when they get too deep the lift sump pumps the effluent to a higher level to continue the flow. This is a standard solution.

The three concrete block buildings at the plant, as hoped for, were done in spiffy time. Some internal equipment is being installed prior to the roof trusses being put on to ease installation. Some metering panels are being installed.

The new 21' trunk line is now in use from the Lower Parker Rd to the Headworks Bldg. Work is progressing on the three measuring flumes, aka JCC, City of Parker, and St. Anthony. This will be part of the revised billing for JCC and the City of Parker.

I am very pleased on how things are progressing. Yea, Go Team, GO!!!!
