PSI Waste Management has been selected by the City Council to collect garbage in St. Anthony.

This new collection system will begin the 1st week of December, 2005. Residential collections will be done once a week on Thursdays. Commercial collection will be done primarily on Tuesdays. Some Businesses will require a second collection. This will be done on Fridays. PSI will begin placing the new garbage carts and dumpsters at homes and businesses as early as the third week of November (Nov. 13 – Nov. 18th). Residences should not use the new carts until

Thursday Dec. 3rd. Flyers will be sent to all residences and businesses twice during the next two months and with the new carts. These flyers will give instructions about the new system, where & how to place the carts, etc.

Remember the City of St. Anthony is still responsible for garbage collection. Any complaints, requests for additional cart, etc., should still be done through the city office. The City will still be billing for garbage collection with your monthly utility bill. The only thing that changes is who is collecting the garbage and how often.

We anticipate all this change over will be smooth. The City staff will be working hard to ensure this orderly change over.

The utility security deposit will now be assessed on every new account by averaging the last twelve month of City utility bills on that property and multiplying that amount by two, so as to provide for a security deposit of two months average utility charges for that property. If it is a new property without a billing history a flat rate of

\$140.00 will be charged for the utility security deposit.
