Please call City Hall at 624-3494 for help. The city government is still responsible for garbage collection and we will resolve each problem as it occurs. Remember, residential collection is once a week on Thursdays except when holidays interfere. Also garbage carts should be placed on the street or as designated the night before collection. PSI begins collection @ 6:00 a.m. Carts should be moved from the street the day of collection to make it handier for placing your garbage in it.

Hoffco Construction continues work on sewer line replacement. They anticipate continued work thru December depending on weather conditions, and then a three month shut down of work is planned. Some streets will have trenches cut in the asphalt thru the winter. The contractor is responsible to keep these as smooth as possible. The city crews will keep an eye on these.
