Police and Fire

Idaho State and City of St. Anthony law require that vehicles be driven and parked on the right side of the roadway, unless it is on a one way street. Parking, picking up, or dropping off passengers or materials at the left curb may be convenient, but is considered less safe and requires driving left of center to get to the left curb. This includes school zones, business areas, or even in front of your or your friend's home. One aspect of safe motoring is predictability. The more predictable your behavior, based on following the rules of the road, the safer you will be with regard to pedestrians and other motorists.

Parks and Recreation

Keefer park shelter has been completed and the back fill and sod

has been laid. If you haven't had a chance to get down and see the work that was done, please do so before the snow flies. This shelter is ready to use for parties and reunions. Please schedule through the City office.

The Litton Park shelter is also completed, but the landscaping will not be done until spring. The shelter has made a very attractive addition to the park.

At Worrell park the tennis and volley ball nets have been removed for the winter and will be put back in place in the spring. At the Sand bar, the concrete sandbox has been removed and replaced with a new one. The back fill is being added to

the back of the concrete walls, and if weather permits, sand will be added to the inside walls before snow falls. The sidewalks and stairs are yet to be added this year and a new slide will be installed in

the spring.

Skate park grass will be planted in the spring due to the construction running later into the fall than had been anticipated.

Water, Sewer and Garbage

Remember that garbage schedule will be on the Friday following the holiday of Christmas. See garbage days that are observed with PSI waste. It will also be helpful during the winter months to be sure to bring your carts in so the snow plows do not hit them.

All vehicles, to operate on a roadway, require registration, and in most cases a drivers license. Unless a vehicle was originally manufactured "street legal" it cannot be made to conform and be registered. Other vehicles may only be driven on private property with the permission of the owner. (Some exceptions for farm vehicles and snowmobiles.)

Go-ped – A motorized skateboard or scooter without a seat.

Moped – A motorcycle <50ccs with pedals or solely powered by electric energy.

Motorcycle – Has 2 or 3 wheels, a seat, and no pedals. (Gas Go-peds with seats and pocket bikes or scaled down motorcycles fit here).

Segway – An electric personal assistive mobility device.
