



Words from Mayor Beck

We announced sometime ago that we have a grant to do a \$100,000.00 paving project on 12th, west from west 4th N, and south

toward Main Street. We have received those funds from the Idaho Transportation Department. We will be asking for proposals on this project soon with construction to begin hopefully within 30 days. We did not expect these funds to do all 4 blocks. We will do all we can to stretch these funds as far as possible.

We have been doing some extensive review of our street conditions and entertaining any and all suggestions that will reduce the cost of repairing our

streets. This subject will be a major item on the agenda for the June 11th, 2008 council meeting.

It was also announced some time ago that our congressional delegation in Washington D. C. were successful in getting a \$565,000.00 appropriation approved to help replace more sewer collection lines. There is a grant application process that we are currently doing to obtain these funds, some snags have occurred. We are working with Sen. Craig and Rep. Simpson's offices to resolve these. This will also be a subject on the agenda for June 11th, 2008.

Department Reports

Police and Fire

The melting snow has given us back our streets. As a result, all State and City parking laws will be enforced, including distance from curbs and roadway edges. Parking in front yards is not allowed except on driveways or on other paved areas. Dirt shoulders are OK for parallel parking in the direction of traffic (right wheels within 18" of the right curb or roadway edge). Angle parking is only authorized where parking spaces are so marked.

Animal Control & Code Compliance

Inoperative vehicles: It is prohibited to store in the open on any property two or more motor vehicles not in running condition, or parts thereof, at any place except at a licensed auto wrecking or junkyard on Hazardous Zone C-3 commercial property. Wadsworth Lumber has

the only zone C-3 property within the city limits.
