



Words from Mayor Beck

A city resident has brought to our attention, the large number of garbage carts that are being left on the streets or in front of homes. City Ordinance 8.12.170 requires that the emptied garbage containers shall be withdrawn from the front of the premises as soon after collection as possible on the same day. We will begin giving warnings to violators of this ordinance this month. We encourage all residences to place the blue carts out of sight. This will enhance the beauty of our city.

We note that yard sale signs are being placed on their own supports and few

continue to place these signs on regulatory signs. This is a violation of law. Any signs so placed will be removed and returned to the yard sale address. Again, all this helps to beautify our city.

The Pioneers Days parade route was beautiful. Thanks to all the city residents and city public works staff for the extra effort. As usual, our Police Department did an excellent job of controlling traffic and people during this event.
