



Words from Mayor Beck

We received a letter last week from a concerned citizen outlining 20 items that needed attention in our town. None of

these items were a surprise to us as city staff and council. As we and you drive around town these items are apparent. Signs with graffiti on them, street signs leaning, weeds growing in alleys and on sides of streets, maintenance of city buildings are all on going issues and receive attention on a regular basis. Other items mentioned such as condition of streets, curbs, and gutter, deteriorating cement in parks, fence at keefer, dirt area north of city building all cost money (lots of money) and would require the residents of St. Anthony to pay higher taxes. The welcome sign south of

St. Anthony belongs to the Chamber of Commerce and is not the cities responsibility. The railing on the river bridge is the responsibility of Idaho Transportation Dept. and does need painting. The tall street lights need painted. The letter ended with a threat to go the press if action is not taken. We appreciate the press and their help in informing public. We welcome their involvement. We thank this citizen and all citizens and welcome their involvement.

Police and Fire

However, there are some students who are crossing Bridge Street in the middle of the block. Also some adults are crossing the middle too. I would just like to let parents know how very dangerous this can be for a student. The drivers can be startled by a student who darts out into the street and the driver may not be

able to stop. Unfortunately, I had a student that recently went out into the street and stopped. Then they bent down and tied their shoe. They also were looking the opposite direction the traffic was coming towards them. Then they walked back to the closest side of the street. Please parents, talk to your children about the danger. Because I care about the students and I want them to know how to be safe.

The intersection at Bridge Street and 4th North is very busy during the hours when the students need to be at school in the morning and in the afternoon when they are released from school. Since there is so much traffic turning from Bridge Street onto 4th North going west, if drivers could travel on 3rd North or 2nd North to turn left onto Bridge Street, there is much less waiting time and congestion.

Please drivers if you could help other drivers see you in the mornings and make sure your car's headlights are on. This would be most beneficial to drivers turning left onto Bridge Street. As the days shorten it will become difficult for drivers to see cars without their headlights on. Having headlights on really will be most appreciated.
