



When will we be getting a new Mayor?

This question can only be answered by the City Council during a regular City Council Meeting. And even then, it may not get answered right away. The City Council and its members could decide to continue as they are and not appoint a Mayor at all or wait until another regular scheduled meeting and appoint one at a later time. If they do decided to continue as they are then the next time the City would have a Mayor would be at the next general election, which will be held in November 2009. The council may decide to appoint someone sooner and that person would then fill the vacancy until that next general election, at which time, they may or may not decide to run for Mayor. What does it take to be Mayor? There are two criteria that must be met to be Mayor. First you must be at least 18 years old and second you must be a registered voter within the City of St. Anthony. In the mean time, it's business as usual at the City. The employees that work for you will continue to do so, with or without a Mayor. Garbage will still get picked up and water and sewer services will continue as usual. Parks and Recreation

Park's had a busy year. We received a grant from the CHC foundation and used it to buy new playground equipment and loose-fill material. Horsey Park received a new slide to replace the old metal one and we will install two spring rockers at Jaycee's park (by the work camp) come spring. We removed the run-down teeter-totters at the ball diamonds and hope to replace them next year. We also hope to replace the merry-go-rounds at Clyde Keefer and St. Anthony South parks next spring. We have (or will have) purchased a merry-go-round from Roy Parker, who made the piece. Thank you Roy!!

After almost three years of planning and applying for grants, we have finally made progress in making the parks safer. We still have some work to

do, but the bigger issues with safety have been dealt with. Next spring we will get our loose-fill put down at Horsey Park and a few of the smaller parks. A slide will be ordered for Clyde Keefer Park, the money was donated by the Rotary Club.

Clyde Keefer had some major work done this fall and it looks good. We removed nine willow trees that had center rot and it really opened the park up. The trees were taken down for safety reasons. The City crew did a great job! We will now be able to plant new trees. Next year we hope to plant quite a few trees at Clyde Keefer and work on the trees down town. We will also finish up on the parks and a few other projects as well.

I want to thank Bill Beck for everything he did to ensure that we had the funds and the opportunity to get done what we did. He made sure our playground fund did not get spent on other items and also was very

supportive of us making the parks safer. I hope the Parks committee can receive the same support from the city council and the interim mayor.

I would like to thank everyone who helped Parks or who donated money or time. We cannot function as a committee without the support of the community. I would especially like to thank Taci Stoddard for all the support and help she gave us as city clerk. She made my job as chairperson easier and we will miss her. I look forward to working with the new city clerk, Patty Parkinson. I would also like to thank Heather Parker for all the work she did for Park's. She was a great help to me and I don't think I could have functioned as well as I did without her. The city crew did a great job this year too. They had a long "To Do List" from me and I appreciate all they did.

Please do not store vehicles that


you do not use on a daily basis in the city right of way. If you have any questions where the right of way is please call the city office.
