## Upcoming PSI Holidays Observed

New Years Day      January 1, 2010  
Memorial Day        May 31, 2010

This applies to both residential and commercial customers.

When there is a holiday that falls during the week scheduled for garbage pick up, then pick up will be one day behind. For example: If the holiday falls on Thursday, then pick up will be Friday and any commercial pick ups on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday would run on the normal day. The Friday pick up would be on Saturday. For Commercial Customers, if the holiday falls on Monday, then Monday pick up will be Tuesday, Tuesday pick up will be Wednesday, Wednesday pick up will be Thursday, Thursday pick up will be Friday, Friday pick up will be Saturday. If the holiday falls on a weekend, Saturday or Sunday, then the pick up schedule will not be affected.

## Utility Rates

### Water:

- Residential Base Rate is \$22.77 plus \$ .47 per 1000 gallons.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$26.13 plus \$ .47 per 1000 gallons.

### Sewer:

- Residential Base Rate is \$28.13 plus \$1.29 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$28.13 per EDU (Equivalent Dwelling Unit) plus \$1.29 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage. The number of EDUs is based on type/use of the facility.

### Sanitation/Garbage Collection:

- Cart Rate (95 gallon) is \$12.23 per month, additional cart is \$4.17 per month.  
Picked up every Thursday, with the exception of holidays.
- Commercial Rate is \$2.85 per yard plus \$3.74 account administration fee.  
Picked up every Tuesday and Friday (if a second pickup is required).

### Services Outside City Limits:

Residents and Businesses outside the City limits will be billed at 1½ times the regular base rates listed above. No additional charges apply on the usage rates.

### Security Deposit:

Deposit is required upon activation of account. Rate will be determined by the previous year's usage for each property. If there is no usage history for the property the deposit will be \$140.00.
