It was a very productive group that collected over 78 bags of garbage and larger items along both sides of Highway 20 on May 19th. Thanks to Kyle Babbitt for coordinating the overall event and bringing water and snacks. She also picked up the special Adopt-A-Highway bags, vests, and signs for the event from Idaho Transportation Department. Many thanks go to: Jeff Davies, Kayla Davies, and other individuals for their efforts. And especially to Joe Hanna who stayed on for the afternoon to help Kyle put away supplies and clean up a missed section of the highway. Jocelyn Haerberle was a great addition again to the help this year. As a Wal-Mart employee, she assisted the City with receiving a donation gift card from Wal-Mart to help pay for the refreshments. She and 7 colleagues spent their morning cleaning the highway median along the Greenway section. Because of their volunteer efforts in the community, the City of St. Anthony was eligible for a Wal-Mart grant. A huge thanks goes to Rod Chandler, Mark

Carlson, and all the participants from the St. Anthony Stake Young Men's and Young Women's Organizations. There were over 70 participants who helped with the highway cleanup. They cleaned both outside and inside the fence line. Another group of about 15 focused on the gravel project on more than the first ½ mile of the Greenway trail. Special thanks also goes to Jim Hobbs, Ben Lokey, Joseph Carlson, and Josh Lehmann who brought ATVs and trailers to move more than a truck load of gravel down the trail. Russ Rupert, George Crapo, and Nick Hubbert loaned some of their equipment. Others loaded and shoveled it on the edges, raked it out, and swept off the asphalt. Deon Davenport, Bob Bauer, and Jerry Reese from the Rotary also pitched in with equipment and trail work. It was a productive day with ongoing work still to be done to finish the edging. In addition, Mayor Neils Theuson, along with Richard Law and others, built new bridges to continue the trail on the north Greenway trail. Thanks also to the moms who made lunch in Horsey Park for about 90 volunteers.

## Additional Outcome of the Annual Greenway Clean Up Day 2012!!

Jocelyn Haerberle, again, was a great addition to the volunteers this year. As a Wal-Mart employee, she assisted the City of St. Anthony with receiving a donation gift card from Wal-Mart to help pay for the refreshments during the event. She and seven of her Wal-Mart colleagues – Deborah Chancellor, William Howard, Jason Wade, Rachel Young, Adelaida Ericemo, Donna Lenz, and Sheila Horn – spent the morning on May 19<sup>th</sup> cleaning the highway median along the Greenway section. Because of their volunteer efforts in the community, the City of St. Anthony just received a \$500 grant to purchase supplies for the Greenway. They plan to use it for additional equipment for the Parks and Recreation Department to use while maintaining the City Parks including the north and south Greenway trails.

## FALL CLEAN UP



In an effort to assist our citizens with leaves and tree branches the city will begin a "Fall Clean Up". We have had such beautiful fall weather and many of us have enjoyed getting out and cleaning up our yards, but have found the garbage carts aren't quite enough for all those leaves and fallen branches. So, November 5-9 city crews will drive around town picking up extra bags of leaves and tree branches. Please use your garbage carts as much as you can and if you find you have extra, please bag up your leaves and bundle tree branches into manageable sizes. The city **will only pick up leaves and branches**. Regular household garbage should be placed into your garbage cart. Our city is beautiful and we want to keep it looking that way!

### City of St. Anthony Utility Rates & Fees Effective 10-01-12

#### Water:

- Residential Base Rate is \$26.34 plus \$ .53 per 1000 gallons.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$30.24 plus \$ .53 per 1000 gallons.

#### Sewer:

- Residential Base Rate is \$28.97 plus \$1.32 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$28.97 per EDU (Equivalent Dwelling Unit) plus \$1.32 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage. The number of EDUs are based on type/use of the facility.

#### Sanitation/Garbage Collection:

- Cart Rate (95 gallon) is \$13.74 per month, additional cart is \$4.67 per month. Picked up every Thursday, with the exception of holidays.
- Commercial Rate is \$3.19 per yard plus \$4.19 account administration fee. Picked up every Tuesday and Friday (if a second pickup is required).

Late Fee: \$6.00 per month.

#### Services Outside City Limits:

Residents and Businesses outside the City limits will be billed at 1½ times the regular base rates listed above. No additional charges apply on the usage rates.

#### Security Deposit:

Deposit is required upon activation of account. Rate will be determined by the previous year's usage for each property. If there is no usage history for the property the deposit will be \$160.00.

#### System Development Charges (for new hookups):

- Water: \$1,870 plus materials
- Sewer: \$1,600 plus materials

Commercial System Development Charges: Call for estimate – additional charges may apply depending on size of lines installed.
