BUSINESS LICENSING Next month the city will begin sending out renewals to businesses for licensing. A city ordinance passed last year requires anyone doing business within the city limits, including home based businesses, to apply or re-apply for a license

before January 1, 2012. For those of you who already applied a renewal notice will be mailed to you.

Winter Parking/Snow

Removal Winter may be just around the corner. With it comes snow and street plowing. City crews will plow streets usually at night, when there are fewer cars to plow around. Remember



if it is snowing to remove your cars from the street. The city may have vehicles towed, at the owner's expense, if they become a hazard or nuisance for the city to try and plow around. We don't want to have to do that, so please try and find a place to park off of the streets.

The city will try and post on their web site, www.cityofstanthony.org, when they will be plowing.

Here is a reminder of parking regulations from the city code: "No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle so as to impede snow removal on city streets from November 1 through March 1 between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m." SAMC 10.40. "It is unlawful for any person to remove snow from private or public property and place it adjacent to or upon the public street in such a manner as to interfere with snow removal by the city, or with vehicle traffic." SAMC 8.32.

And as **general parking reminders**, with few exceptions:

1. Vehicles, including trailers, are not to be parked on the city right of way longer than 48 hrs.
2. A trailer parked in the right of way must be attached to a vehicle capable of towing it.
3. Semis and other large vehicles are not to be parked in the right of way in residential areas.
4. Vehicles are to be parked on the right side of the roadway facing with the flow of traffic.

ADDRESSES There are still some properties in St. Anthony which do not have an address displayed. It is important to emergency responders – ambulance, police, and fire – to have a readily visible address displayed. Sometimes critical care is delayed trying to locate the place of the emergency. It is recommended that all property owners with structures on those properties ensure that an address is displayed and visible from the street.

Dogs are required to be maintained at all times in a fenced yard, house/garage/building, or on a leash. City of St. Anthony dog tags are required, except for visitor's dogs which require a current tag from the visitor's city or county. A dog with a tag gets one free return if it ends up with the police.



If you have more than 2 dogs, a kennel license is required. With a kennel license, you may have a maximum of 5 dogs, either yours or visitors. Cats are not regulated other than by the state Health Department's interests in cleanliness. Chickens, ducks, geese, goats or other non-common pets are basically not allowed in the city.

So, November 5-9 city crews will drive around town picking up extra bags of leaves and tree branches. Please use your garbage carts as much as you can and if you find you have extra, please bag up your leaves and bundle tree branches into manageable sizes. The city **will only pick up leaves and branches**. Regular household garbage should be placed into your garbage cart. Our city is beautiful and we want to keep it looking that way!

City of St. Anthony Utility Rates & Fees Effective 10-01-12

Water:

- Residential Base Rate is \$26.34 plus \$.53 per 1000 gallons.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$30.24 plus \$.53 per 1000 gallons.

Sewer:

- Residential Base Rate is \$28.97 plus \$1.32 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage.
- Commercial Base Rate is \$28.97 per EDU (Equivalent Dwelling Unit) plus \$1.32 per 1000 gallons of average winter water usage. The number of EDUs are based on type/use of the facility.

Sanitation/Garbage Collection:

- Cart Rate (95 gallon) is \$13.74 per month, additional cart is \$4.67 per month. Picked up every Thursday, with the exception of holidays.
- Commercial Rate is \$3.19 per yard plus \$4.19 account administration fee. Picked up every Tuesday and Friday (if a second pickup is required).

Late Fee: \$6.00 per month.

Services Outside City Limits:

Residents and Businesses outside the City limits will be billed at 1½ times the regular base rates listed above. No additional charges apply on the usage rates.

Security Deposit:

Deposit is required upon activation of account. Rate will be determined by the previous year's usage for each property. If there is no usage history for the property the deposit will be \$160.00.

System Development Charges (for new hookups):

- Water: \$1,870 plus materials
- Sewer: \$1,600 plus materials

Commercial System Development Charges: Call for estimate – additional charges may apply depending on size of lines installed.
