

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-1

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ST. ANTHONY MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 2.48.10 TO AMEND THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS OF THE CITY RECREATION COMMISSION FROM TEN MEMBERS TO EIGHT MEMBERS; TO ALLOW FOR TWO OF THE MEMBERS TO RESIDE IN THE CITY IMPACT AREA; AND, ESTABLISHING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

1. Section 2.48.10 of the St. Anthony Municipal Code is hereby amended, to read as follows:

2.48.10 Created. There is created a commission which shall be designated as the recreation commission, which commission shall be composed of ~~ten~~ eight voting members to be appointed by the mayor with the advice and consent of the council; one of the members to be a member of the city council and ~~nine~~ seven other members, ~~all of whom~~ five of which shall be residents of the city and two of which may reside in the city's impact area.


2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-4

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY INTO THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO; ORDERING PROPER FILING AND RECORDATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AFTER PASSAGE; ESTABLISHING THE ZONING CATEGORY OF THE ANNEXED PROPERTY; AND, ESTABLISHING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the owners of certain real property adjoining the City have either in writing requested or impliedly consented to annexation into the City of St. Anthony of that real property; and

WHEREAS, the land requested to be annexed borders the City of St. Anthony and is wholly owned by the parties requesting or impliedly consenting to annexation, qualifies as a "Category A" annexation; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission has held the required public hearing on this matter, and thereafter determined that the land requested to be annexed is suitable for annexation, and annexation thereof does not require any changes to the City Comprehensive Plan, and that the land should be zoned as a R-1A category; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That certain real property bordering the City of St. Anthony, Idaho, which is described more fully in Exhibit A, and which is mapped out in Exhibit B, which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby annexed into and made a part of the City of St. Anthony, Idaho, and zoned R-1A.

2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance, within 10 days following the effective date hereof, with the Fremont County auditor, treasurer and assessor, and the Idaho State Tax Commission.

3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect 30 days after its passage and publication, all as provided by law.

ORDINANCE 2005- 5

2005-2006 FY FINAL APPROPRIATION BUDGET

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2005, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$2,298,027 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR, AUTHORIZING A LEVY OF A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY AND SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SAID APPROPRIATION IS MADE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of St. Anthony, Fremont County, Idaho:

Section 1: That the sum of \$2,298,027 be, and the same is appropriated to defray the necessary expenditures and liabilities of the City of St. Anthony, Fremont County, Idaho, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2005.

Section 2: The objects and purposes for which such appropriation is made, and the amount of each object and purpose is as follows:



Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.



ANTHONY, IDAHO IN THE SUM OF \$1,058,727; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO:


SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2004-7, the appropriation ordinance for the City of St. Anthony, Idaho, for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2004, and ending September 30, 2005, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-7

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO PROHIBITING THE USE OF DYNAMIC BRAKING DEVICES OR SIMILAR ENGINE DEVICES WITHIN THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. A new section 10.42.010 et. seq., is hereby created in the St. Anthony Municipal Code, which section shall be known as the Compression Brake Law, which shall read as follows:

10.42.010 Compression Brake law.

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to operate any motor vehicle with a Dynamic Braking device engaged within the City of St Anthony, Idaho.

Section 2: "Dynamic Braking device" is defined as a device used primarily on trucks for the conversion of the engine from an internal combustion to air compressor for the purpose of braking. Dynamic engine device is also commonly referred to as a "Jacobs Brake;" "Engine Brake" or "Compression Brake."

Section 3: Any person or entity which violates this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by confinement in the county jail for a period not to exceed six months, or by a fine not to exceed \$300 , and/or both such fine and imprisonment.

2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-8

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING FOR TEMPORARY SPECIAL USE PERMITS TO BE GRANTED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR OCCUPIED RECREATIONAL VEHICLES TO BE PARKED ON CITY STREETS; DESCRIBING CONDITIONS FOR SUCH PERMITS; PROVIDING FOR PERMIT FEES; AND, ESTABLISHING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. ANTHONY, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Notwithstanding any other city ordinance to the contrary, the St. Anthony Police Department may grant a temporary special use permit for the temporary parking of occupied recreational vehicles on city streets, under the following conditions:

- a. Such permits may only be issued to and at the request of the owner or resident of the property in front of which such recreational vehicle is to be parked;
- b. Such permits may be granted for no longer than 5 consecutive days, and for no more than 25 days in any 12 month period;
- c. Such permits must be posted on the permitted recreational vehicle so as to be visible from the street;
- d. Such permits may only be granted when in the sole discretion of the Police Department there are no vehicle, pedestrian or other safety issues raised by allowing such a permit;
- e. Such permits may only be granted for recreational vehicles which will be occupied during the permitted parking period;
- f. Recreational Vehicle is defined as any motorized vehicle or trailer fitted so as to provide living quarters within the vehicle or trailer.

2. A fee of \$2.50 per each 24 hour period for which the permit is sought, shall be paid in advance to the office of the City Clerk, prior to the issuance of any such permit.

3. Any person parking a recreational vehicle on a city street without first obtaining such a special use permit as provided herein, will be punishable under the appropriate city ordinance.

4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication, all as provided by law.
